<p><u>Welcome and Introduction</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Community Restoration Cluster welcomed the participants and for their participation which was followed by a round of introduction. 	
<p><u>Presentation on CoRe 2017's activities and feedback</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> CoRe will work under HSP Objective 1 in 2017 (improve self-sufficiency and resilience of FATA, ensuring a smooth transition to longer-term recovery and development) to provide humanitarian assistances 80% returnees and 20% TDPs in host communities. CoRe has developed two sub objectives <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Provide diversified livelihoods support to IDPs that have returned to FATA and IDPs in hosting areas: where business support, cash for work, livelihood/CBDRR trainings and women livelihood grants will be catered. Rehabilitation of community based infrastructure to improve access to services and promote resilient recovery where rehabilitation of medium scale and community needs based infrastructure will be provided. CoRe to share updated activity plan with updated 4Ws with cluster members to report only one year activities. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> CoRe to share presentation on 2017's activities with cluster members.

<p><u>Feedback on CoRe's working group in Bannu</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CoRe has briefed cluster members on establishment of working group of in Bannu (as 80% returned has been completed) to monitor the actual ground situation and to serve the purpose of humanitarian coordination/assistance accordingly. • To analyze the need of CoRe working group in the current humanitarian need, on request PAWT has arranged a meeting on 17 Jan, 2017 with NGOs and local organizations working in nearby areas. The purpose of Working Group is to include the partner organizations which cannot attend the provincial meeting at Peshawar and to share updated information on humanitarian needs, gaps, lack of resources. • Request for the working Group at Bannu was extremely demanded and fortified as local organization and NGOs have showed keen interest in cluster coordination mechanism and 4Ws to incorporate updated information accordingly. • Cluster members endorsed PAWT to co-chair CoRe's working group in Bannu. Meeting invitation, minutes and attendance sheet will be shared with provincial working group to incorporate feedback/inputs accordingly. • Establishment of working group in other FATA agencies will be catered on need bases. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CoRe coordinator with the support of PAWT, AHO and ADF will develop TORs of the working group. • After approval of TORs, CoRe to share working group initiative email with UNOCHA. • CoRe to chair first working group meeting in Bannu. Date/time/venue TBC. • CoRe will facilitate capacity building trainings if requested.

<p><u>Partners Updates</u></p> <p>Acted: Acted with the funding support of ECHO implement livelihood activities in district Peshawar (UCs: Achani Bala, Sulman khel, Peshtakhara Payan, Pajagai and Kankola). Duration will be July 2016 to June 2017 with total budget of € 135619. Total beneficiaries will be 600 (Total: CFW Men=250, CCG Women=300 and CCG Men=50). ACTED will focus 95% IDPs and 5 % locals. Achievement</p> <p>PAWT: PAWT's Work in progress on 24 CPIs in NWA. 40 Male Community networks and 7 female Community network formed. 10 Community events have been planned.</p> <p>SERHAD: SARHAD will conduct Need assessment survey in Bajaur, Khyber, SWA and Orakzai in support of UNDP.</p> <p>WFP: WFP is providing food to 6000 HH in Mir Ali of NWA. 9000 HH for food for work/Cash for Food in SWA. 4000 HH in food assistance in Kurram and Orakzai. WFP is also running CBDRR inclusive Project in Bajour and Mohmand. WFP also have future plan for CBDRR project in Bara: 4 DWSS Schemes rehab started which includes solarization plus machinery and storage and 2 new DWSS schemes and 1 protection wall.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Highlighting gaps and priorities, Greater Accountability, cannot work in isolation, all stakeholders must take responsibility and ownership. • What is changing: Anything that can be done on the old system can be done on the new system with a lot more, Tracking pass-through funding without double counting. Detailed breakdowns of funding, use of cash-based assistance or management costs. Reports are according to IATI standards. International Aid Transparency Initiative: Technical publishing framework allowing data to be compared. iatistandard.org provides details on standards, how to implement and provide guidance. Financial data analysis and visualizations for all types of users. • When is the change happening: 23rd Jan 2017. Old archive site of FTS is still active and will be active later as well but it will not be updated after 23rd Jan 2017. • Learning the new system and reporting errors or suggestions: Tutorials about the new features and use of the new system will be available as soon as the new system is online.
