

2016 Logical Framework

GOAL 1:

Early Recovery is systematically mainstreamed into humanitarian action and humanitarian and development actors are brought together to ensure faster and successful transition to sustainable and resilient-based development

STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE 1:

Integration of Early Recovery into all the phases of the current humanitarian program cycle and into the operational programming of all the Clusters

RESULTS

- 1. Early Recovery starts at the onset of the crisis*
- 2. Early Recovery is integrated into the Humanitarian Program Cycle and Cluster Response Plans*
- 3. Joint multi-year post-crisis transition planning and programming linking humanitarian and development frameworks and financing address vulnerabilities (including displacement) through preparedness, relief, early recovery, recovery and reconstruction*

OUTPUTS

- 1.1 Guidance note on Inter-Cluster Early Recovery rolled out
- 2.1 Early Recovery considerations are incorporated into all steps of the HPC
- 2.2 Cluster Response Plans at the country level show integration of Early Recovery considerations
- 3.1 Humanitarian and development actors jointly develop country integrated needs and vulnerabilities frameworks and local integrated operational frameworks addressing vulnerabilities including displacement (Humanitarian and Development Actors Group HDAG)
- 3.2 Humanitarian plans linked to longer-term recovery, reconstruction, development strategies and frameworks

GOAL 2:

Increase Early Recovery response capacity and operational support at the country level for more predictable, better-resourced, planned and managed response

STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE 2:

Global Cluster is effectively managed to support partners and stakeholders at all levels

RESULTS

1. *An effective and well-functioning Global Cluster for Early Recovery*
2. *Improved support to coordination, quality and accountability of the response at the field level*
3. *Increased technical support and resource mobilization*
