As a humanitarian worker, you often have little time to build your professional skills and strengthen your knowledge in humanitarian programming. This online course will allow you to learn how to develop effective programming during a time that is convenient for you. This three hour, self-paced course will provide information and scenarios which will enable you to practice developing a more effective humanitarian response.

By the end of this course, you will know the basic steps that a humanitarian worker must take to ensure gender equality in programming. The course will include information on the core issues of gender and how it relates to other aspects of humanitarian response.
