Till date 12.8 USD million a funding gap to fill. • TDP secretariat has shared an update about letter of intent and its process which will enable clusters to avail NOC in improved and swift manners. • It was mentioned clearly by TDP secretariat that national staff with valid NOC can move to their project areas however international staff have to fill travel NOC form to take approval from FDMA. • ToRs for Technical Working Groups (TWGs) have been developed by RRU and will finalized by the support of cluster leads. Four TWGs will be notified WASH; Livelihoods/INRM & Economic Growth; CLCP and Education. DRR/Protection and Gender will be catered as cross cutting.
